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Hour Zero Safety Drills


With nicer weather on its way, we will again be practicing our outdoor safety drills as well as continue with our indoor safety drills. These drills include:

During an emergency, our first priority is the safety of our students and staff. Hour-Zero provides schools with the tools, tactics, and training needed to prepare and respond to emergencies. We regularly practice drills as a way for students and staff to learn how to respond should an emergency situation arise.
